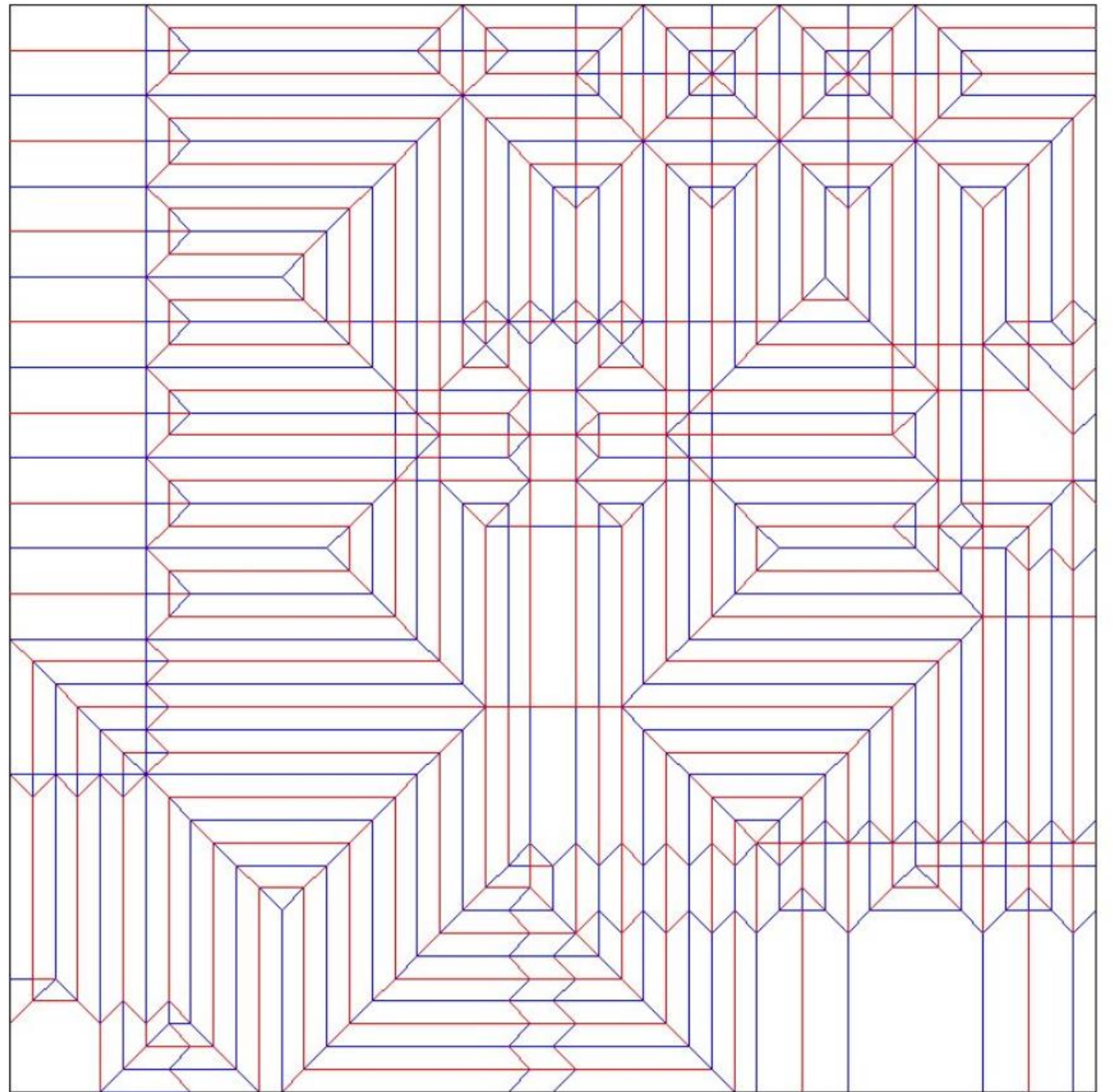

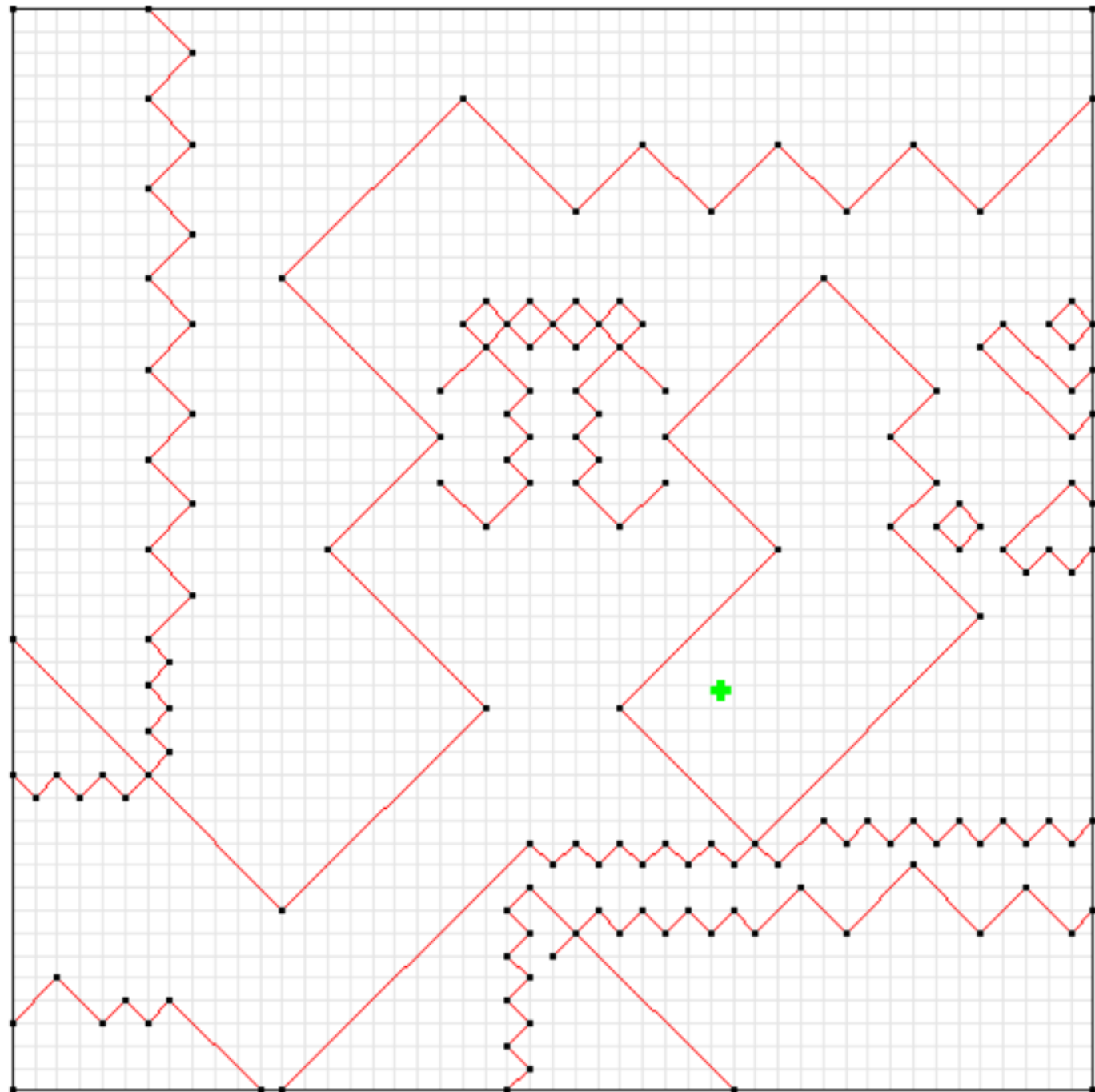

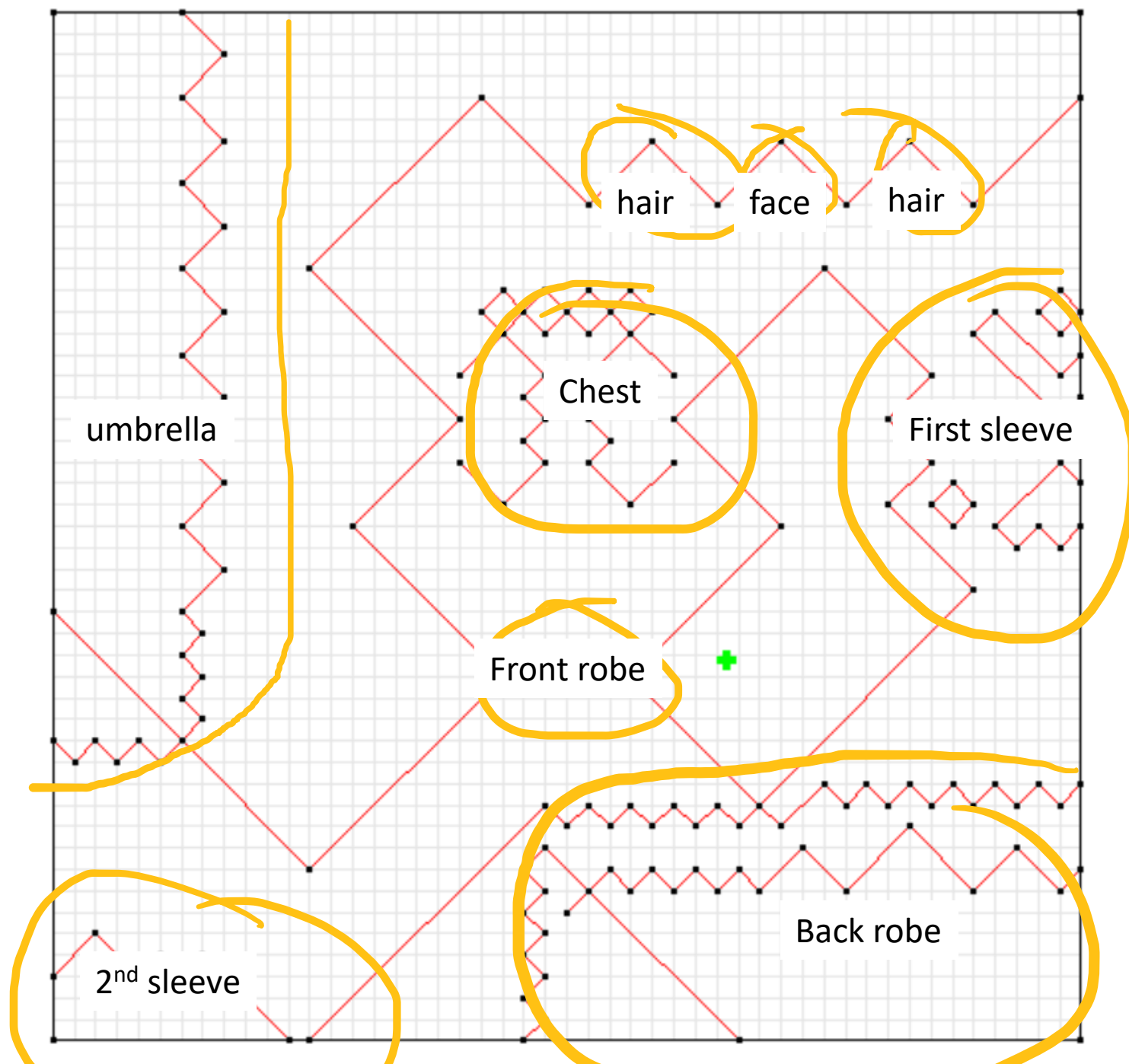
Full cp

Flap allocation



Start with a square.

I recommend using a square that is 50cm.
The square I am currently using is 40cm.

Foil is good for shaping but it may be difficult
for beginners to collapse.

I suppose double tissue is good.



Make a 48 grid

Done by dividing 3>6>48



Draw on the simplified
cp

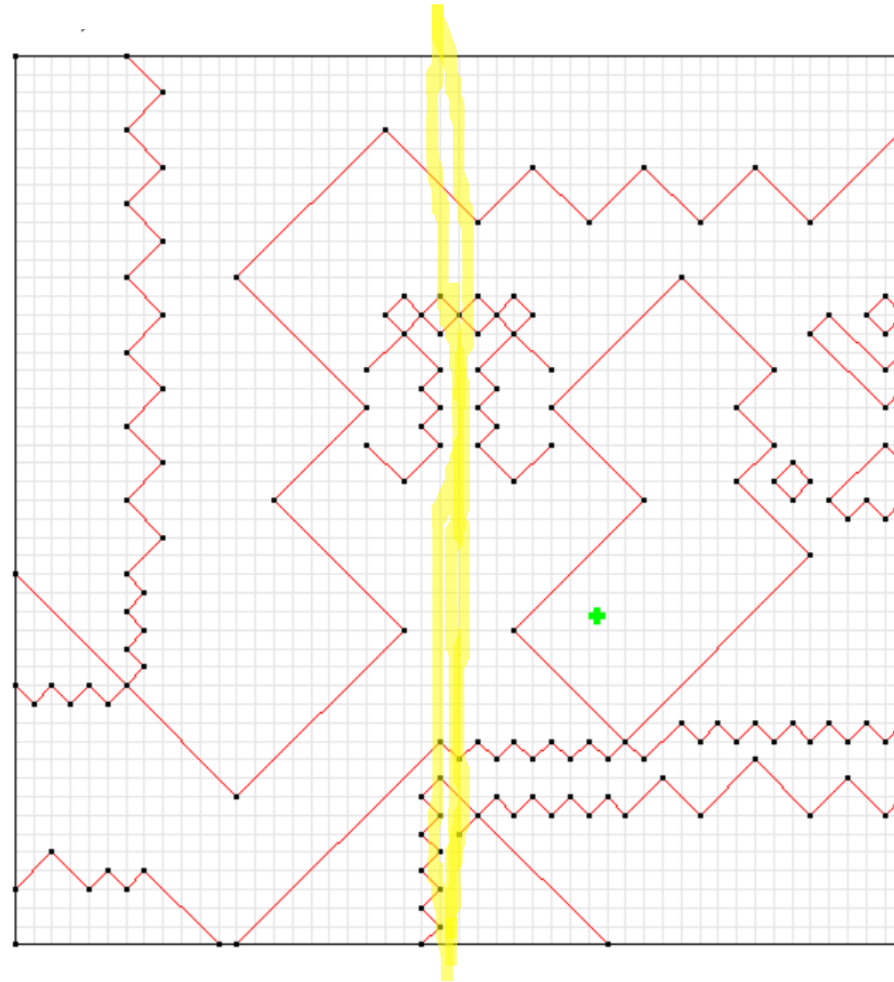
And precrease if you want to. (lol)



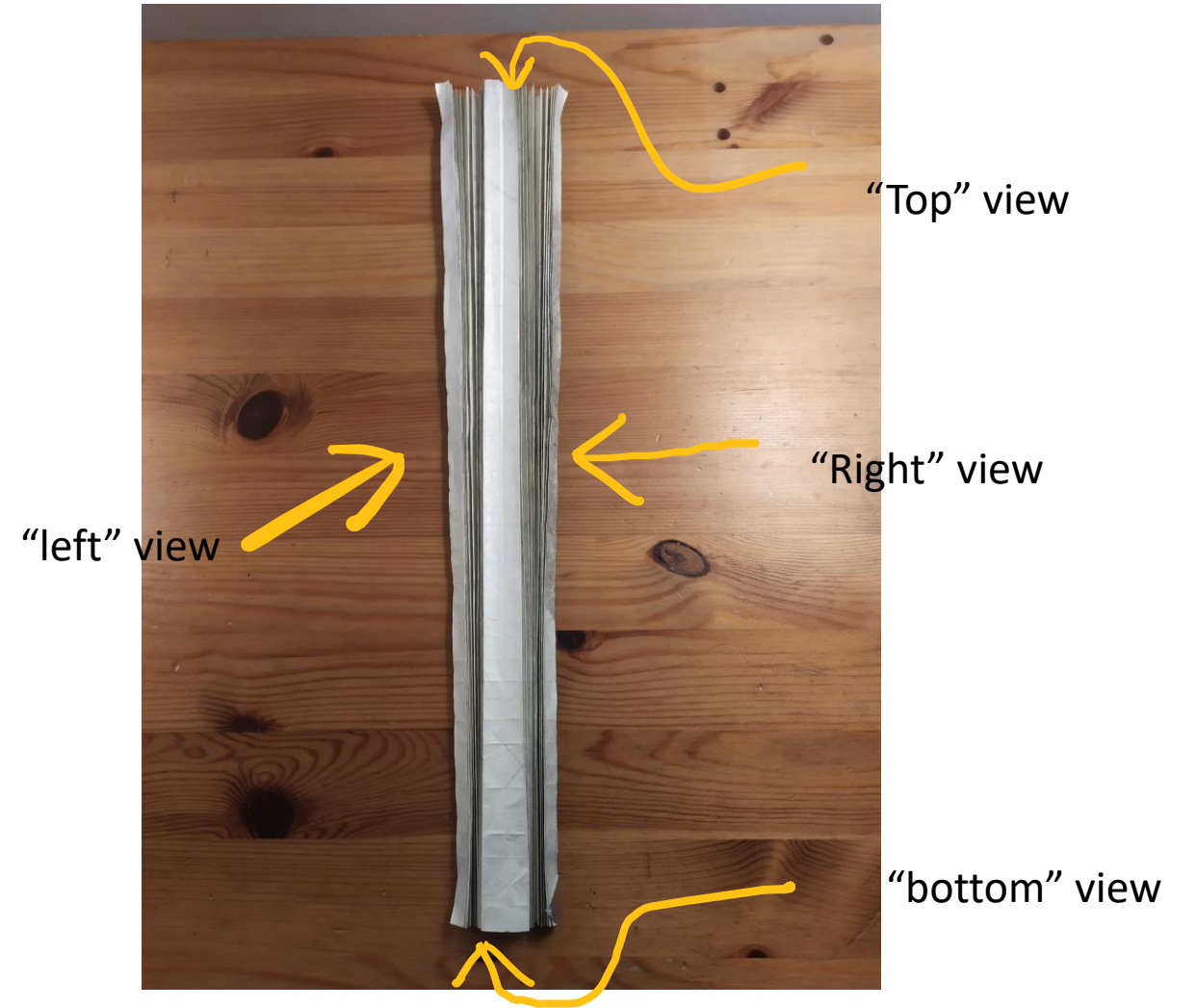

Fold down a flap



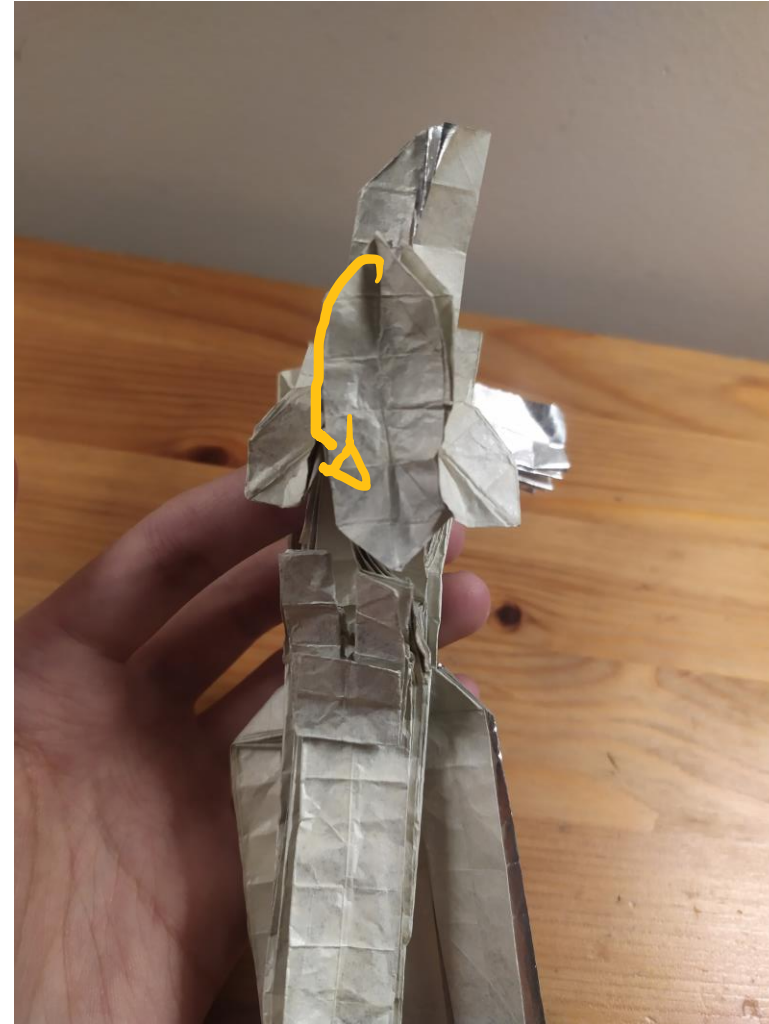
